

We're also hoping to connect youth with supportive mentors to act as positive role models". She continues, "This exhibition is about honoring the nearly 12,000 NYC children living in foster care and the hundreds waiting and ready to be adopted. We are thankful to the Office of LGBTQ Policy & Practice at the NYC Administration for Children's Services for helping to bring this exhibition to fruition and in the public eye."

Celebrity and notable photographers, each of whom donated her/his talent and time to create the portraits on display, hope their expressive images capture the hearts of prospective adoptive families.
